It's been dinosaur week here at Flying Start! We have lots of children who are interested in dinosaurs, so we decided we would incorporate them into lots of our activities to further engage the children in their learning. The children have used playdough to make and count dinosaur spikes and have made dinosaur fossils. They've been on a dinosaur dig and made maps to go on a dinosaur hunt. There has been a lot of dinosaur small world play and the children have used our loose parts to further develop imaginative play. We've learnt some dinosaur names and explored descriptive vocabulary. During the week the children showed an interest in using the stencils and parking the cars, so on Thursday we set up paper taped to the floor so children could draw their own road and car park and use the stencils as much as they liked.

Loose Parts

These are our bits and bobs that we have collected e.g. pegs, curtain rings, lolly pop sticks, shells, stones, packaging, boxes, blocks. The children enjoy using their imagination and creativity to play and explore. Our loose parts are great to support children's different schemas. Schemas are a style of play. Have you ever noticed your child putting everything into a bag, taking it somewhere else and tipping it out? This is called transporting. Have you ever seen your child place objects in lines, patterns or rows? This is called positioning. It doesn't matter what the toy is, it's the style of play that's more important. Children could be lining up cups, coins, cars or animals.
